NOTE:

The above list represent the most common hazardous chemical materials approved by the NCDOC for facility use; however, you are advised to read all labels or Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) on any chemicals, cleaning agents, or supplies, etc. that you work with and be in compliance with warnings for those materials.

Agreements:

1. The Hazard Communication program has been explained to me, including an explanation of the Labeling System and the Material Safety Data Sheets.
2. I understand that I have the right to review all Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) and the listing of all hazardous materials used in my assigned facility workplace.
3. I have been informed to read and follow the label instructions given on all products of the NC Correction Enterprise manufacturing products that could be harmful to my health. I will immediately report to my supervisor, all accidents and/or spills. I am familiar with first aid procedures and how to clean up any chemical spills.
4. I have been informed of the methods and observations that may be used to detect the presence or release of a hazardous chemical in the work area. I have been informed of the physical and health hazards of the chemicals in my work area and the measures I can take to protect myself from these hazards, including appropriate work practices, emergency procedures, and Personal Protective Equipment (**PPE**) to be used.
5. I agree to wear the Personal Protective Equipment (**PPE**) required for the materials with which I am handling or working with in the performance of my duties. I also understand that failure to wear the required PPE is a violation of OSHA Safety Standards and a violation of a direct order which may result in disciplinary action. I further understand that if I damage or destroy the **PPE** issued to me in my workplace, disciplinary action could be taken against me. It is my responsibility, in order to help maintain a safe workplace environment to report to my direct supervisor any defective or damaged **PPE** that I may encounter in my workplace.
